1. To formally welcome all the members of the Board of Studies.

The Director, MIET introduced and welcomed all the external members of the Board of Studies and outlined the vision to formulate a modern, industry-relevant and holistic curriculum for the BBA LLB (Hons.) programs.

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2. To formulate the curriculum for 1st & 2nd semesters of the BBA LLB (Hons.) program for 2022-27 batch.

Resolved that the curriculum for the 1st and 2nd semesters of the BBA LLB (Hons.) program is aligned with the model curriculum prescribed by the Bar Council of India and was endorsed to the Academic Council for its approval after incorporating the following additions/amendments in the curriculum suggested by the members:

b) The members further suggested that case laws should be included wherever necessary with proper citations.

The changes have been incorporated and appended as **Annexure I** and the detailed modified curriculum is attached as **Annexure II**.

The members appreciated the following aspects of the proposed curriculum:

- 1. Legal Database Lab course has been introduced in the 1st semester to expose students to the Indian Law Database.
- 2. Legal Research and Writing has been introduced in the 1st semester to prepare students for undertaking quality research and drafting in the law profession.

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- 3. A non-credit course "Student Induction" has been introduced in the 1st semester to help new students adjust and feel comfortable in the new environment, inculcate in them the ethos and culture of the institution, help them build bonds with other students and faculty members, and expose them to a sense of larger purpose and self-exploration.
- 4. An employability and skill development course on Corporate Etiquette & Personality Development has been introduced in the 2nd semester to develop soft skills as per the industry requirement.
- 5. In addition to this a non-credit MOOC course has been introduced in the 2nd semester to encourage self-learning among students. The department level committee shall identify a course focusing on skill development at the beginning of the semester.
