2. To formulate the curriculum for 3rd & 4th semesters of the BBA LLB (Hons.) program for 2022-27 batch.

Resolved that the curriculum for the 3rd and 4th semesters of the BBA LLB (Hons.) program be endorsed to the Academic Council for its approval after incorporating the following additions/amendments in the curriculum suggested by the members:

Intellectual Property Rights in response to the growing demand for innovative technologies. It was								
informed that such co	ourses would be available in the subsequent semesters.							

The changes have been incorporated and appended as **Annexure I** and the detailed modified curriculum is attached as **Annexure II**.

The highlights of the proposed curriculum include:

- Inclusion of 13 generic core courses in management and law including 7 courses in the 3rd semester and 6 courses in the 4th semester.
- Provision for the students to select one elective course from a set of two available courses in 3rd and 4th semester.
- A one-credit internship course has been incorporated into the 3rd semester curriculum with a primary focus on equipping students with managerial skills in preparation for the industry.
- In addition to this, a non-credit MOOC course has been introduced in the 4th semester to encourage self-learning among students.

LLB-206 Law of Crimes-I	The Committee Members proposed removing the Topic "1.3 Extent and Operation of the Indian Penal Code (Sections 1-5)" from Unit-1 and suggested replacing it with a different subject.									

The changes have been incorporated and appended as **Annexure III** and the detailed modified curriculum is attached as **Annexure IV**.

The highlights of the proposed curriculum include:

- Inclusion of 14 Generic Core Courses in Law including 7 courses in 1st and 7 courses in 2nd semesters have been introduced.
- Legal Database Lab course has been introduced in the 1st semester to expose students to the Indian Law Database.
- Legal Research and Writing has been introduced in the 2nd semester to prepare students for undertaking quality research and drafting in the law profession.
- A non-credit course "Student Induction" has been introduced in the 1st semester to help new students adjust and feel comfortable in the new environment, inculcate in them the ethos and culture of the institution, help them build bonds with other students and faculty members, and expose them to a sense of larger purpose and self-exploration.

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- A course on Corporate Etiquette & Personality Development has been introduced in the 1st semester to develop soft skills as per the industry requirement.
- In addition to this, a non-credit MOOC course has been introduced in the 2nd semester to encourage self-learning among students.
